




Tonight, after the evening service, we will partake of the Lord's Supper in remembrance of His sacrifice for us.

ROD AND ROSE VINCENT OUR MISSIONARIES TO THE NAVAJOS

Greetings from Navajo Land,

Two weeks before school terminated for summer, Bro. Lloyd Lopez came with three of his children. With the help of Jesus, he had achieved victory over his drinking and rehabilitated his life. Since two of the children were using the same books as Rose was using, it was easy to incorporate them into classes. Aileen, the oldest, needed to graduate from 8th grade. We added her and the others into our final program.

They needed a place to stay so we moved them into the upstairs apartment of the church. Bro. Lloyd preaches when Rod is unable, and he has reinstated midweek services. Once a week, he takes people to the Hope program (an addiction and help program) at College Heights Baptist in Farmington.

Late one rainy night in September, our grandson Kenny went to check out a howling coyote. Stepping out of the vehicle, he went down into the mud hitting a rock and broke his leg. Crawling into the vehicle, he fell again striking the running board. He managed to drive home and wake us. Rose drove him 70 miles to the hospital in Farmington. They were able to admit him immediately. Rose then drove back home, acquired a few hours sleep, and returned for his operation. His leg was broken in several places. Pray for him as he continues to struggle with acute pain and trying to walk.

Rod had skin cancer successfully removed from his nose in October. Pray for him. He is still preaching, but he is having considerable difficulties communicating.

We have several problems which need prayer as how to resolve them. The engine went out of our ¾ ton 4 x 4 truck. Our furnace stopped working. It needs repair, but we can't find anyone who know how to work on this type of furnace. We desperately need a tractor. Thank you for your prayers. The Vincents
